Water Protection Fund - Riparian Restoration

The 3-year project is defined below:

- Decrease water loss along the Gila River by removing invasive tamarisk,
- Improve long-term riparian ecosystem functioning and restore native habitat for wildlife,
- Create a long-term tamarisk management plan for the WNRCD and strengthen on-going collaborative conservation between ranchers, farmers, county and town governments, government agencies, non-government organizations, and public citizens

i.e. Project: Reduce soil loss and improve water quality in the Little Colorado River watershed by November 2023. Program: Facilitate a workshop on range land improvements.

- 1) remove tamarisk along the Gila River on approximately 17-acres of the General Kearny Sheriff's Mounted Posse of Pinal County property;
- 2) remove tamarisk along the Gila River on approximately 3-acres of the DuBoise Ranch private property;
- 3) revegetate approximately 105-acre riparian corridor on Town of Kearny property where tamarisk is currently being removed by other project partners,
- 4) create a Tamarisk Management Plan for the WNRCD outlining future tamarisk treatment methods, priority restoration sites, revegetation goals, and monitoring

i.e. Project: Restore 11 acres in the Little Colorado River watershed by November 2023. Program: Facilitate a total of 3 workshops in the District by November 2023.
